The AMCRC provides many valuable resources to residents of Lower Merion and Narberth. The Center has a full-choice food pantry where residents living with low incomes come to shop for fresh produce, milk, and bread, frozen meat, and pre-packaged and canned food. There is a licensed social worker on site to assist with applying for benefits, services, and emergency financial assistance. The financial assistance has strict income guidelines, is available for those in need of utility, rental assistance, or other emergency items, and is generally capped at a few hundred dollars. As with all programs at ElderNet, applicants must be residents of Lower Merion or Narberth. Proof of residency and income verification are needed each year, as your situation changes, or upon request as required to update our records. Additionally, if claiming dependents under the age of 18, updated copies of each child's report card are required.
